Students must inform their Form Teachers if they are absent from the exam and submit a Medical Certificate when they return to school. Students may leave the school after completing their exam for the day.

11 Students are **not required to attend school on 11 October** which is the school's Marking Day, as well as **Friday 18 October** which is the Results Processing Day.

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Extended Curriculum for Sec 3 O-Level Subjects - 28-30 October & 1 November

14 We will be setting aside the first week of the year-end school holidays (28-30 Oct & 1 Nov) to better prepare our Sec 3 O-Level students for their graduating year in 2025. Details of the programme will be made known to them by their subject teachers at a later date.

Last Day of School – 25 October (Friday)/ Holiday Assignments

15 Please note that Friday 25 October is the last day of school for the year. To help your child/ward revise key topics and prepare for the following year, subject teachers may identify some assignments to be done in November-December. We appreciate your support in ensuring that your child/ward completes the assignments in stages over the holidays so that he/she will have sufficient time to rest before school reopens.

16 A number of activities will continue to take place until 15 November, e.g. Student Leadership training, CCA practice and enrichment activities. The respective teachers-in-charge of these activities will be informing you of the schedule and your child's/ward's commitment through Parents Gateway.

Please note that students who are currently on MOE FAS or SAC FAS in 2024 are required to re-apply if they want to continue receiving financial assistance in 2024. Eligible applicants can apply by submitting the application form together with the required supporting documents to the General Office or via the eFAS form. The forms are available in the General Office and on the school website. Please submit your application form together with the supporting documents to the General Office by 11 Oct 2024 to prevent unnecessary delay in the issue of textbooks and uniforms.

Travel Declaration

20 For our necessary monitoring, the school will be sending out a message via Parents Gateway for you to indicate your travel plans. Given the emerging global health concerns, do also check the Travel Advisory at the MFA website (<https://www.mfa.gov.sg/Where-Are-You-Travelling-To>) prior to your year-end travels. A declaration is NOT required if your child/ward does not intend to travel overseas.
